What's the Future of Non-Emergency Medical Transportation In 4.0?

Adding non-emergency medical transportation (NEMT) services to 4.0 locations can offer several benefits, both for the company and the communities it serves.

Non-emergency medical transportation (NEMT) refers to transportation services provided to individuals who need to get to and from medical appointments, treatments, or other healthcare-related services but do not require emergency medical care during transport. This service is crucial for individuals who have mobility issues, lack access to reliable



transportation, or are otherwise unable to drive themselves due to medical or financial reasons.

Liz Wilhelmi, manager of the NEMT division, is based out of the Norwood bus garage which has been going through renovations over the last year. Just like student transportation there are a number of regulatory and compliance processes that we are completing. Liz will start servicing a handful of counties including: McLeod, Carver, Scoot, Sibley, LeSueur, Nicollet, and Blue Earth. Once these areas are established we will expand into Wright and Hennepin county. By growing gradually, Liz will tackle problems as they come and build a strong foundation for long term success.

Taking a slow and steady approach to expanding might seem frustrating when some of us are eager to help out our drivers with more hours. This way, the NEMT division isn't just a short-lived success; it is built for sustainable, long term growth.


Welcome Montevideo To The 4.0 Team!
